Course description

Learning outcomes

- Acquire direct experience with activities that involve the four basic skills (reading, writing, listening, and speaking) in the classroom;
- Observe and absorb authentic German communication practices;
- Reflect on teaching profession in a more critical, productive, and enthusiastic way;
- Compare different learning and teaching practices;
- Enhance school-kit with new tools to teach.

Tentative schedule

Day 1 – Course introduction & setting goals

- Introduction to the course, the school, and the external week activities;
- Presentations of the participants' schools;
- Identification of needs and goals for each participant and relevant populations.

Day 2, 3, 4 & 5 – German grammar and conversation

Day 6 – Course closure and cultural activities

- Course evaluation: round-up of acquired competencies, feedback, and discussion;
- Awarding of the course Certificate of Attendance;
- Excursion and other external cultural activities.

Course modifications are subject to the trainer's discretion. If you would like to discuss a specific topic, please indicate it at least 4 weeks in advance.
