However, as these are fundamental for supporting students' life and academic success, it is also essential for teachers to update their capacity to connect with parents to contemporary standards.

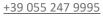

The course will, hence, offer them an opportunity to explore their social and emotional skills in order to manage effective relationships with families and support them in difficult situations.

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Moreover, the course will review intercultural communication strategies, providing participants with the essential competencies for interacting with families coming from very diverse cultural backgrounds.

Finally, participants will acquire practical knowledge about several digital educational platforms as tools to enhance cooperation between parents and teachers, and support students in their learning process.

Day 4 – The Challenges of Teaching Vs The Challenges of Parenting

- Handling conflicts: theory and practice;
- Supporting parents in challenging situations;
- Parent-Teacher Relationship in a multicultural community;
- Developing Intercultural communication skills.

Day 5 – What's your idea?

- How to create effective Parent-Teacher partnerships;
- Teaching and Parenting in the 21st century: useful digital resources for educators and families;
- Designing an action plan for your school community;
- Presenting your project.

Day 6 – Course closure and cultural activities

- Course evaluation: round-up of acquired competencies, feedback, and discussion.
