Heart of Helsinki is green! Seurasaari Island and Sibelius Park tell a tale of the great love of nature we Finns have – also in an urban setting.

We meet up at Kamppi Bus station at platform 47 where we hop on the bus n:o 24.

Seurasaari island was turned into a peoples' park as early as in the 19th century and it is still the townspeople's favourite site for camping and celebrations. We wander through the rocky hills, damp dells and groves, and delight in watching the tame birds and squirrels of the island.

The **Outdoor Museum** presents Finnish living, working and lifestyle from the past centuries. We stop by for some coffee and snacks at the **Café Mieritz** that was originally built as the forest ranger's house.

On our way back we hop off the bus and visit a park named after the beloved national composer of Finland, Jean Sibelius. **Sibelius Park** is best known for the **Sibelius Monument**, a breathtaking statue sculptured by artist Eila Hiltunen. The Monument is like music frozen in tangible form.
